## Our Lenten Journey

Forty (40) days of Lent. Why 40? In the Bible, the number 40 is used to refer to a very long time. You'll remember the 40 days rain fell after Noah built the ark. And the Israelite's long trek through the wilderness that took 40 years. David ruled over Israel for 40 years. Jesus was in the wilderness fasting 40 days and 40 nights. Probably none of these events actually occurred in 40 days/nights or years – rather just a very long time.

All these events were significant in the faith journeys recorded in the Bible. The early church designated 40 days (excluding Sundays) as a special seasonal journey leading to Easter, a time for contemplation and spiritual renewal, a time to prepare for the surprise and joy of Easter Sunday.

Skeptic that I can be, I just checked this year's count. Yes, Easter Sunday is April 12, exactly 40 days from Ash Wednesday, February 25.

What will our Lenten Journey be like here at First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Festus? The Worship Focus during this time will be around the development of Jesus' ministry as told in Mark and John. Every Sunday of Lent we will have a *Lenten Lunch and Learn* in Wiles Fellowship Hall after morning worship. While sharing a light lunch (provided by a different church group each week), we will discuss who we are as the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Together we will journey through our heritage – from the tumult of the American Revolution to now. We will learn more about who we are as church, our history, our beliefs, our structure, our Vision -- to be a faithful, growing church, that demonstrates true community, deep Christian spirituality and a passion for justice. (*Micah 6:8*), and our Mission -- to be and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, witnessing, loving and serving from our doorsteps "to the ends of the earth." (*Acts 1:8*) The presentations and discussions will be led by Lisa Grace, our student minister, and me. Please plan to join in.

We will also be journeying closer to our dream of having a building that is accessible to all, where we can grow in our understanding and practice of genuine hospitality. The Opening New Doors for the Future Building Campaign is progressing every day.

And during all these journeys, we will be conscious of the anxiety of our times. The *big picture* is always God's love for all of creation. In these troubled economic waters we are all in, our hearts and minds must be shaken open to receive the transforming power of God whom we know in Jesus Christ. The time spent in worship will be especially important during these times. We hope to provide a sanctuary for our worried and wearied souls and to calm our anxious hearts and minds.

*"Lent is a time to take the time to let the power of our faith story take hold of us, a time to let the events get up and walk around in us, a time to intensify our living into Christ...."*<sup>1</sup>

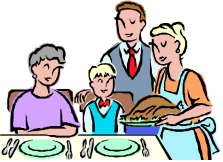
## Parish Nurse

Third, you must pray to God daily to give you the strength and guidance to stay the course on your stewardship journey in the commitment you made.

The *“Doors”* are just being unlocked. As they are beginning to open, we must prepare, as good stewards, to walk through them with committed hearts and minds to embrace, and to act upon, all of the wonderful stewardship opportunities God has put before us.

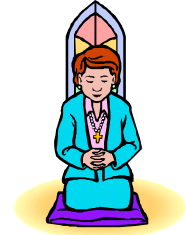

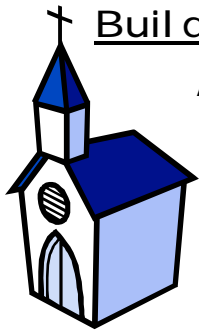

## Building Campaign

As with any major change within a church not everyone will agree with how things are done. I have been told and have heard that some of our members are distressed for various reasons about the new building campaign. Everyone, whether you give to this campaign or not - support it or not, is a loved and cherished member of our church family. Do not let this campaign burden your heart. If you feel burdened please talk to our pastor or to an elder about your concerns. Jesus loves you and so do we.

You are probably aware that we had a Valentine dinner combined with our Capital Campaign pledge commitments on Sunday, February 15. I am happy to report we are making wonderful progress towards reaching our goal. Our donations and pledges total approximately \$85,500. Our total goal for the building is \$175,000. This goal was developed last year before the economic down turn. We expect the cost of the building to be far less than the goal now. We have had 23 pledges so far. We need total of 30 to 33 pledges to kick off construction.

Please understand that there is no minimum or maximum pledge. You can pledge as little or as much as you wish. We also are in great need of the time and talents of our congregation. Your time and talents are as important gifts as are financial gifts. We can not finance the project based on pledges and gifts alone. We need to raise funds through other sources. We will be having several on going fund raisers to support the project. We already have a fund raiser collecting ink cartridges and cell phone for recycling. Thanks to Joe Combs great work we have collection boxes in 39 locations throughout the Twin City area. We will also have *Schwanns* selling products on our parking lot on Saturday, April 18th. We will get a portion of the proceeds from the sale. There are other fund raisers we are working on that will be announced in the near future. The congregations help with these fund raisers will assure their success. Of course the church is always in need of our prayers. God bless you all.
