Moments with Janet – October 2009

Radical Hospitality

On Saturday, September 19, five of us went to the Southeast Gateway Area Assembly at Union Avenue Christian Church in St. Louis. The theme of the Assembly was *Radical Hospitality*. In addition to wonderful fellowship, a productive business session, and outstanding worship, we attended some workshops.

Radical Hospitality is more than just being nice to new visitors. Of course, that's important, but that's only a very small and the easiest part. *Radical Hospitality* is making each person, everybody, feel not just welcomed but included. There were workshops on Worship Ministry, Youth, Children in Worship, Intergenerational Programming, Dismantling Racism, Open and Affirming Congregations, plus the one I led on Disabilities and Welcome. All were designed to help take stock of our own churches, their physical structure, and their atmosphere.

One interesting program was presented by First Christian Church in Kennett, "*Dinner with the Disciples --Intergenerational Ministry.*" Every Wednesday, from September through May, they have dinner together in their Fellowship Hall from 5:30 to 6:15. They charge \$4.00 per person. No one brings any food. It's all prepared/provided by the "*Dinner with the Disciples*" Committee. People come directly from work and school. After dinner, some stay for meetings, choir practice, supervised homework, and other activities. It's a way to have a night at church together. Visitors and newcomers are especially encouraged to participate as guests for the first few times they come.

In our session on Disabilities and Welcome, several churches discussed problems similar to ours. Even those churches that are all on one floor have problems with steps up to the chancel, lecterns and pulpits that are too tall, doorways too narrow for wheelchairs. It was eye opening and informative as we shared possible solutions.

Sometimes I think it's possible to get so used to the way things are around us that we might miss something that visitors sense or feel about our building, our congregation, and our worship. For example, should we expect that everyone who comes to visit is a regular church goer and knows by memory the Lord's Prayer, or the Doxology, or knows by instinct whether to hold the communion cup and drink it together with others or to drink it and replace it in the tray? Is our Worship Bulletin easy to follow?

How about pretending you're a first-time-visitor some Sunday. Keep your antennae up to hospitality issues. I know some churches that have an outside friend come as a "*mystery visitor*," and then share impressions with the appropriate Ministry Group.

Think about all this and share ideas with each other and with me. We're made great hospitality progress with the work being done on the building expansion to make our church better accessible to people with physical disabilities. What about other obstructions to people with mobility problems, such as access to the choir area, the chancel, the south entrance into the sanctuary? Look for others.

I also suggest that you think about how we might include more people, newcomers and regulars, in our worship, our classes, our groups, our fellowship, our church.

Let's brainstorm ideas so that we can become even better at practicing *Radical Hospitality*. If you'd like, send ideas in and we'll put them in the November newsletter. We have much to share here at FCC Festus. Let's spread the Good News.

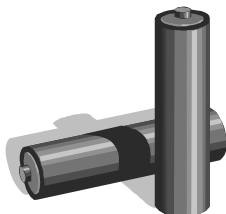
WORSHIP

September 20th., we just had what I consider one of the best worship services we've had in a long while. The choir was back from summer hiatus with a great anthem. **Jack-e Merseal** did a wonderful children's moment. **Rev. Janet** gave a powerful sermon that really challenged us to rethink our style of living. And the congregation itself was fired up and enthusiastic. I tell you, when a church is in action, living out God's love actively in outreach and fellowship, you can really feel it in when we gather together to praise God. Also, our elders led a prayer service in memory of the 9/11 tragedy. This too was a powerful witness to the Holy Spirit at work in us through our collective worship.

You may have noticed me messing around with a new electronic gizmo the last few weeks. This is a digital recording device that will allow us to record worship services and copy them to CDs to distribute to our shut-ins and anyone else who is interested. I've been testing out different positions and microphone options to get the optimum sound quality, and soon we will be able to provide a needed service to those who may have trouble joining us for worship on Sunday mornings.

In order for this audio ministry to be effective, we need your help. First, we are in need of *portable CD players* that we can distribute to our shut-ins, as some don't have CD players of their own. Maybe some of you have Walkman style CD players that you no longer use because you upgraded to an mp3 player or iPod. If you do, consider donating that Walkman to our audio ministry. Also, we will be in need of *blank recordable CDs* and *AA batteries* as well, to keep the sounds of worship going. **Volunteers** are also needed to help with the recording of services and the transferring of recordings to CD, something that most people with a CD burner in their computer can do. Please prayerfully consider helping out in this worthwhile enhancement of our worship services. Donations of these items can be given to **me, Lemmy Merseal**, or *just left on top of the sound system box at the back of the sanctuary.*
